



- CAFOD's Floating Garden Project in Bangladesh through the Big Lent Walk.







Jesus Cleanses the Temple.




What do you see

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



– The Washing of the Feet.






Jesus Washes the Feet of the Disciples.

Jesus Washes the Feet of the Disciples.



Just before the Last Supper, Jesus knelt to wash his disciples feet, hot and dusty from the road outside.

Some of the disciples were shocked that Jesus, their beloved leader should stoop to carry out such a lowly task. Jesus explained that he had done this act of love for them to show that he came to serve others. Just as Jesus knelt in humility to serve his disciples, he invites us to do the same – to look for ways to love and serve those around us.

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

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
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

**'Jesus uttered a loud cry and
breathed his last'**

Mark 15:37

If you were at the foot of the
cross, what would you be
feeling?



Jesus Dies on the Cross.

Just as God breathed life into Adam, Jesus' final breath on the cross represents the 'new creation'. We have been forgiven, now we can live a new life free from sin.

The final cry by Jesus was not a defeat, but a sign of his strength and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit onto his disciples and then onto us to live by his example.

1. Where have I seen God?:

Become aware of God's presence. Invite the Holy Spirit to bring moments and events to your mind.



2. What am I thankful for?:

During this past week, what are you most thankful for? Pay attention to even the small things: the food you ate, a conversation you had, something beautiful you saw, little pleasures.

Prepare for prayer.

We take a moment to pray the Examen together. Place your hands together, you can put your head on the desk if you wish! As you listen to the song reflect on the five stages .



3. How have I been feeling?:

Pay attention to your emotions. Reflect on the feelings you experienced during this week. Boredom? Elation? Compassion? Confidence? What might God be saying through these feelings?

5. How do I feel about tomorrow?:

Now we shift our gaze forward. Pay attention to the feelings that surface as you survey what's coming up. Are you doubtful? Cheerful? Apprehensive? Allow these feelings to turn into prayer. Seek God's guidance. Ask him for help and understanding. Pray for

hope. **REMEMBER – You are loved!**



4. What should I pray for?:

Allow God to highlight something you have reflected on, be it an event, a small joy or a feeling and turn it into a prayer. Let the prayer flow from your heart and let it take whatever form it needs: intercession, praise, repentance, or gratitude.



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
