The Sunday Gospel...

The Parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37)

Jesus said, "There was once a man who was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho when robbers attacked him and beat him up, leaving him half dead. It so happened that a priest was going down that road; but when he saw the man, he walked on by on the other side. In the same way a Levite also came there, went over and looked at the man, and then walked on by on the other side. But a Samaritan who was travelling that way came upon the man, and when he saw him, his heart was filled with pity. He went over to him, poured oil and wine on his wounds and bandaged them; then he put the man on his own animal and took him to an inn, where he took care of him. And Jesus concluded, "In your opinion, which one of these three acted like a neighbour toward the man attacked by the robbers?" The teacher of the Law answered, "The one who was kind to him." Jesus replied, "Go then, and do the same."

Understanding the Gospel:

The Gospel reminds us that God's law calls us to love. The readings show us how love for God and love for others cannot be separated. The parable of the Good Samaritan challenges us to act with compassion, even when it is not easy.

We are invited to let go of grudges and choose love. Jesus shows us how to look past divisions and see every person as a neighbour. When we act with mercy, we become the people God calls us to be.



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

Monday, 14th July is the Feast of St. Camillus de Lellis (1550-1614). Born in Bucchianico in Italy, he spent his youth as a soldier of fortune. Eventually, left penniless through gambling, he found employment at a hospital for incurables in Rome. Influenced by St Philip of Neri and others, Camillus was ordained a priest.

In 1584 he founded the Servants of the Sick or Camillians. Wearing a red cross on their chests, they vowed to serve the sick, even at risk of their own lives. They cared for the plague stricken on board ships in the harbour of Rome and for wounded troops on the battlefield. He was canonized in 1746, was declared patron of the sick, of nurses and of nursing groups.



1. Be Still

Spend a few moments looking back over the events of this year in the company of the Holy Spirit.

Prepare

Place your hands together, you can put your head on the desk if you wish! As you listen to the music reflect on the five stages.

5. Hope

Ask God to give you light for tomorrow's challenges and gifts.

Walk forward as a Pilgrim of Hope.

2. Give thanks

Walk through the past year and thank God for every gift you encountered. Look at the work you did, the people you interacted with. What did you receive from these people? What did you give to them? How have you grown?



Reflect on times you have seen or felt God's love at work – at home, at school, with family and friends.
What is God saying through these encounters?



4. Pray

Ask the Holy Spirit to direct you to something that has been particularly important this year. Pray about it from your heart. It could be a prayer of praise, repentance, thanks or a prayer asking for help.
