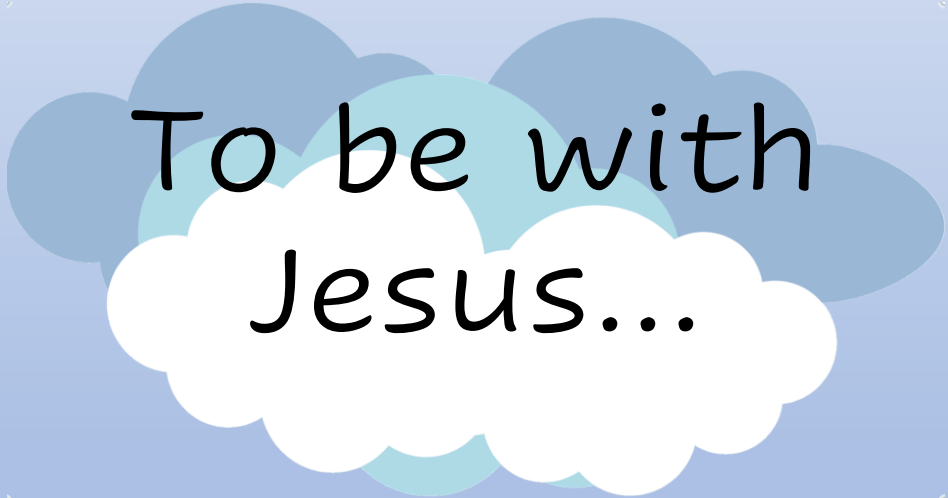

The 'Word'

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The Gospel – John 2:13-22

Since the Passover of the Jews was near, Jesus went up to Jerusalem. He found in the temple area those who sold oxen, sheep, and doves, as well as the money-changers seated there. He made a whip out of cords and drove them all out of the temple area, with the sheep and oxen, and spilled the coins of the money-changers and overturned their tables, and to those who sold doves he said, “Take these out of here, and stop making my Father’s house a marketplace.”

At this the Jews answered and said to him, “What sign can you show us for doing this?”

Jesus said to them, “Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up.”

The Jews said, “This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and you will raise it up in three days?”

But he was speaking about the temple of his Body. Therefore, when he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they came to believe the Scripture and the word Jesus had spoken.



The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica – 9th November:

Located in Rome, this is the cathedral church of the Pope, called the “mother of all churches.” Our faith is shared by millions around the world; a sign of unity, we are part of something much larger than ourselves. We are part of the body of Christ.

The Gospel reflects on the importance of places of worship, the significance of our sacred space. The history of the Lateran Basilica reminds us that our faith has deep roots. The Church has gone through challenges, yet it continues to stand strong. This encourages us to stay committed to our faith, even when things are difficult. Our lives, like the basilica, can be rebuilt and renewed through God’s grace. We are living stones, working together as God’s holy dwelling.



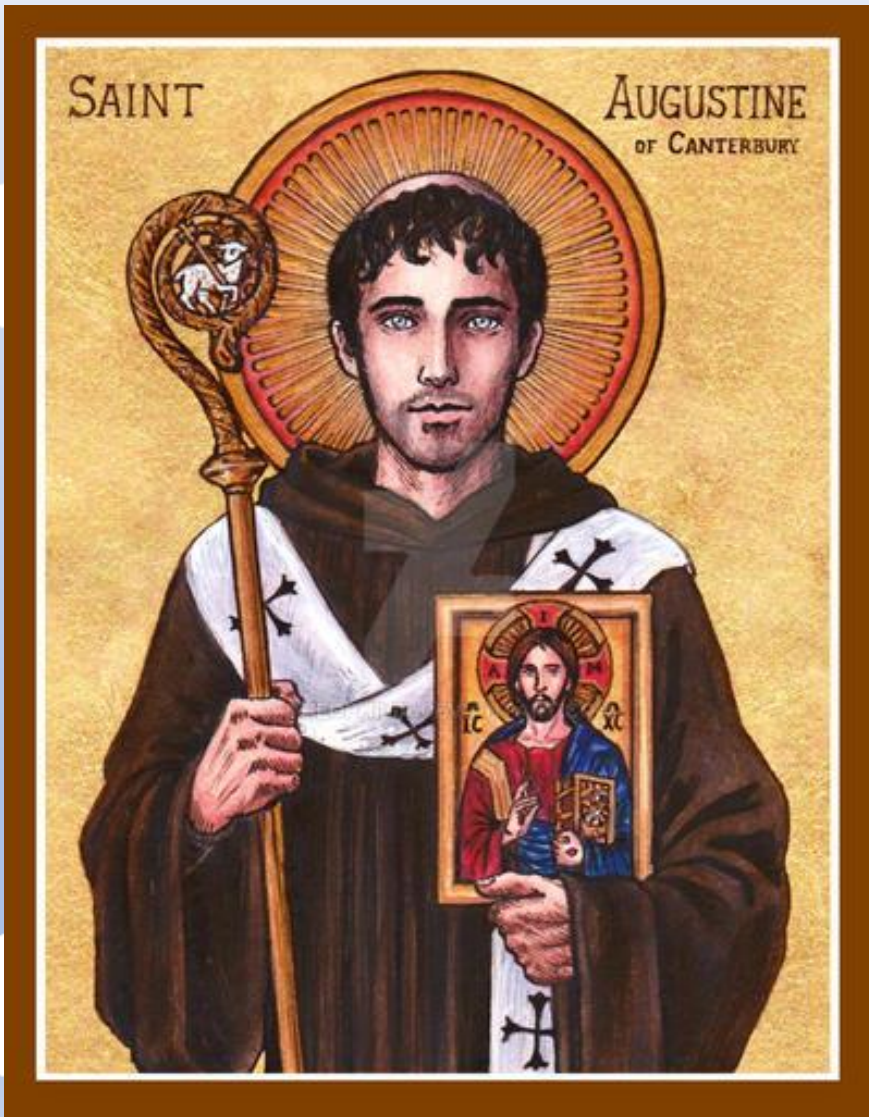

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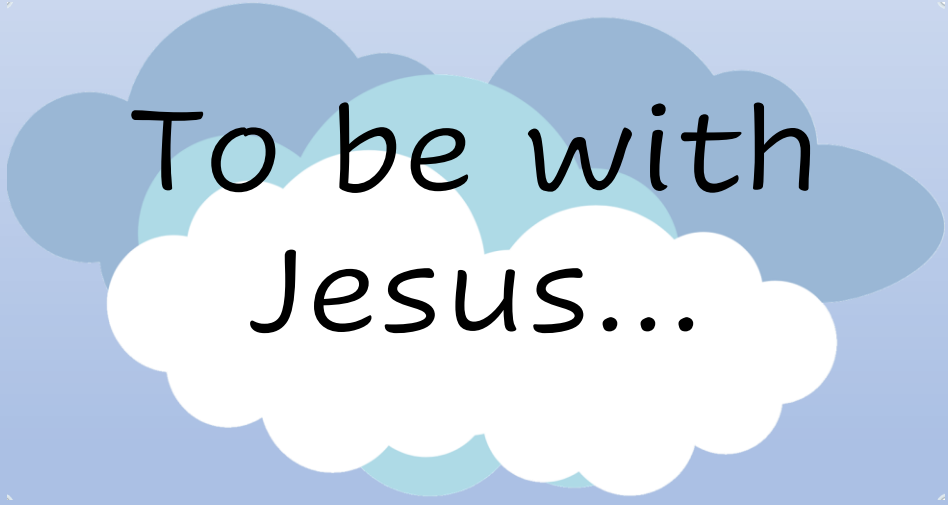
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Examen Friday

Place your hands together, you can put your head on the desk if you wish! As you listen to the music reflect on the five stages.



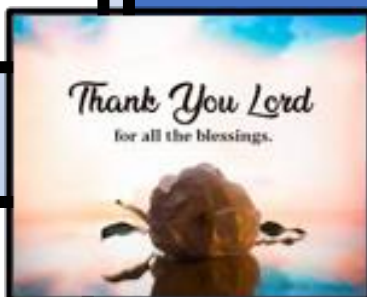
5. Hope
