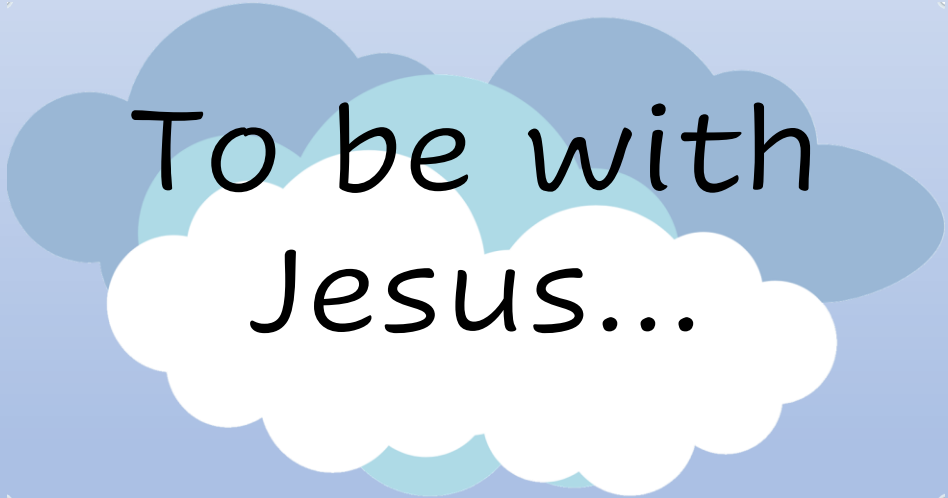

# Word for the Week

Monday 26<sup>th</sup> January

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## The Gospel – Matthew 4:12-17

When Jesus heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew to Galilee.

He left Nazareth and went to live in Capernaum by the sea, in the region of Zebulun and Naphtali, that what had been said through Isaiah the prophet might be fulfilled:

*Land of Zebulun and land of Naphtali, the way to the sea, beyond the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles, the people who sit in darkness have seen a great light, on those dwelling in a land overshadowed by death, light has arisen.*

From that time on, Jesus began to preach and say, “Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.”

As he was walking by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon who is called Peter, and his brother Andrew, casting a net into the sea; they were fishermen. He said to them, “Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men.” At once they left their nets and followed him.



## Understanding the Gospel:

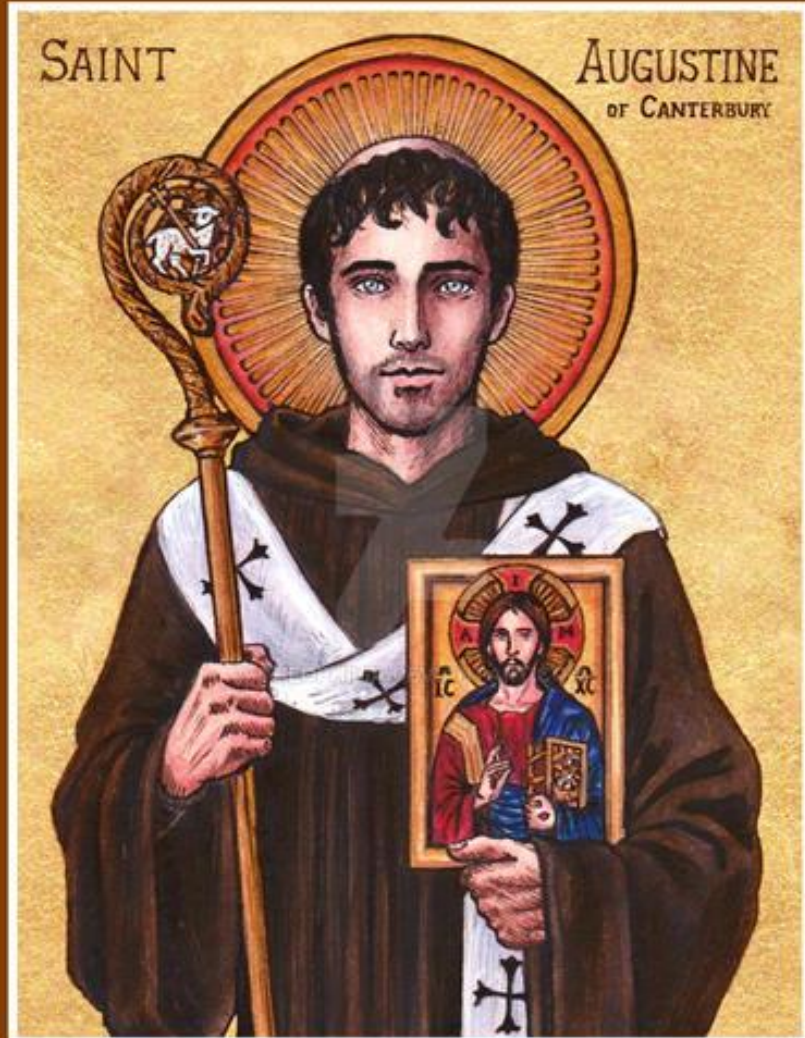
This Sunday in the Gospel Jesus begins preaching and calling his first followers- simple fishermen called to follow Him and spread the Good News. This reminds us that God doesn't choose us based on our skills or status but on our willingness to serve. He brings light to Galilee, a place people often forgot. He tells the fishermen to turn their lives around and follow him. His message is simple but clear: the kingdom of heaven is close.

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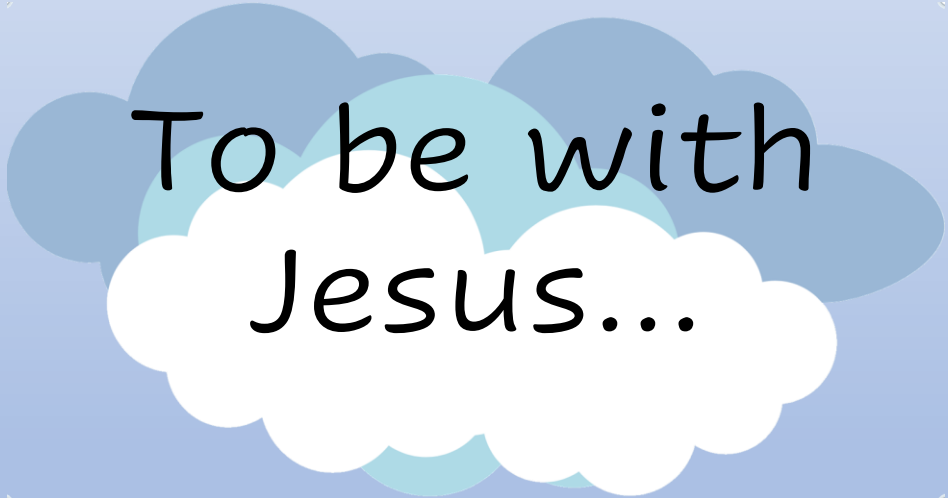




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# Seasons Tuesday

Tuesday 27<sup>th</sup> January

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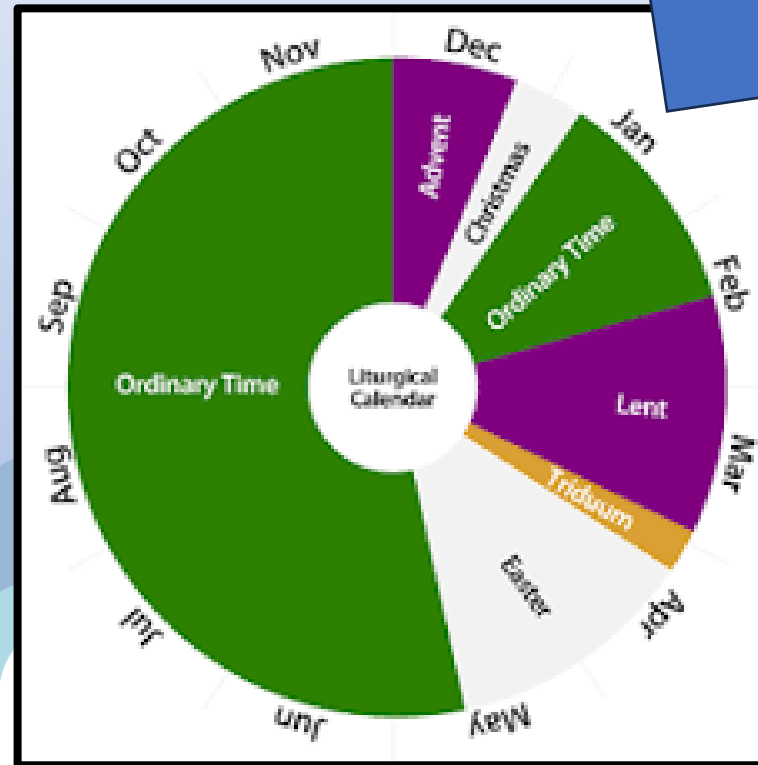
We are now back in Ordinary Time, the time in between the great seasons and celebrations of the Church year.

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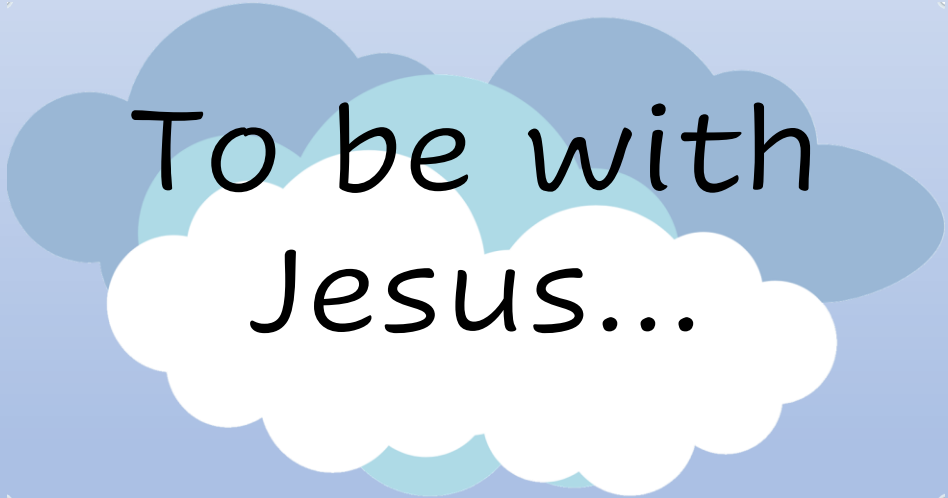

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This half term our Catholic Social Teaching focus is -

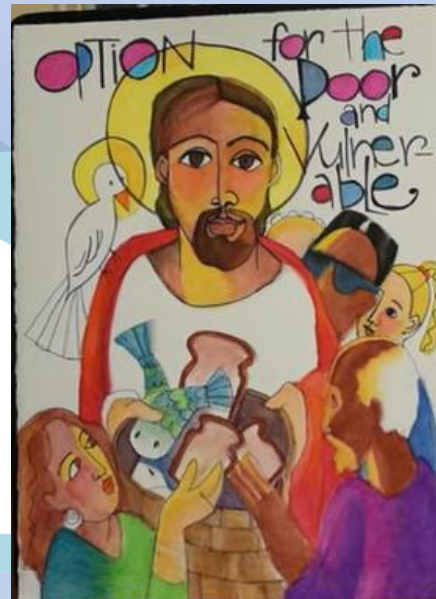
## ***Preferential Option for the Poor.***

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

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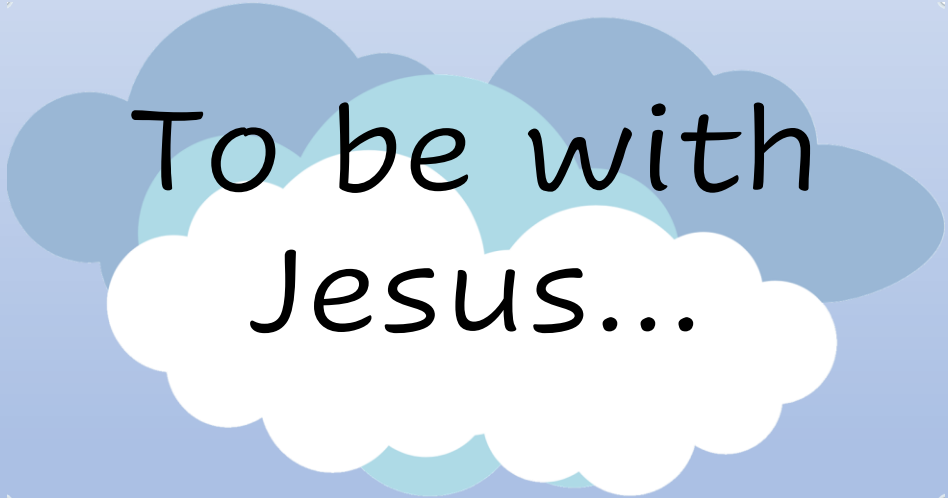
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**1. Give thanks:** Reflect on the good things you have experienced this week... unity with your family, with your friends, with school.
