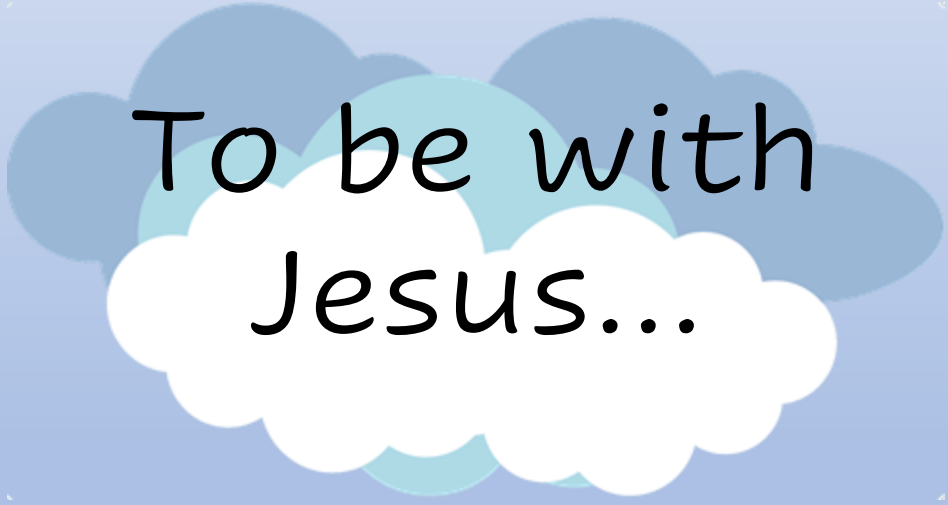

# The 'Word'

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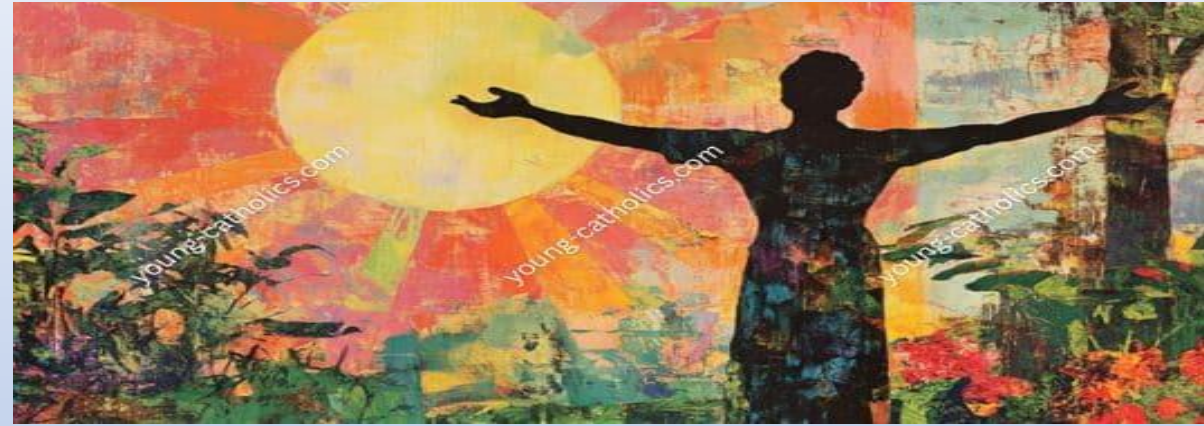
## The Gospel – Luke 17:11-19

As Jesus continued his journey to Jerusalem, he travelled through Samaria and Galilee. As he was entering a village, ten lepers met him. They stood at a distance from him and raised their voices, saying, “Jesus, Master! Have pity on us!”

And when he saw them, he said, “Go show yourselves to the priests.”

As they were going, they were cleansed. And one of them, realising he had been healed, returned, glorifying God in a loud voice; and he fell at the feet of Jesus and thanked him. He was a Samaritan. Jesus said in reply, “Ten were cleansed, were they not? Where are the other nine? Has none but this foreigner returned to give thanks to God?”

Then he said to him, “Stand up and go; your faith has saved you.”



## Understanding the Gospel:

The Gospel this Sunday, reminds us to notice God's blessings. It shows healing, mercy, and the gift of faith. We are reminded that gratitude should be a habit, not just an occasional response. Like the healed leper who returned, we should take time to thank God for what He has done. Gratitude strengthens faith because it helps us see God's work in our lives. The Gospel challenges us to be like the one who returned, not like the nine who took their healing for granted.



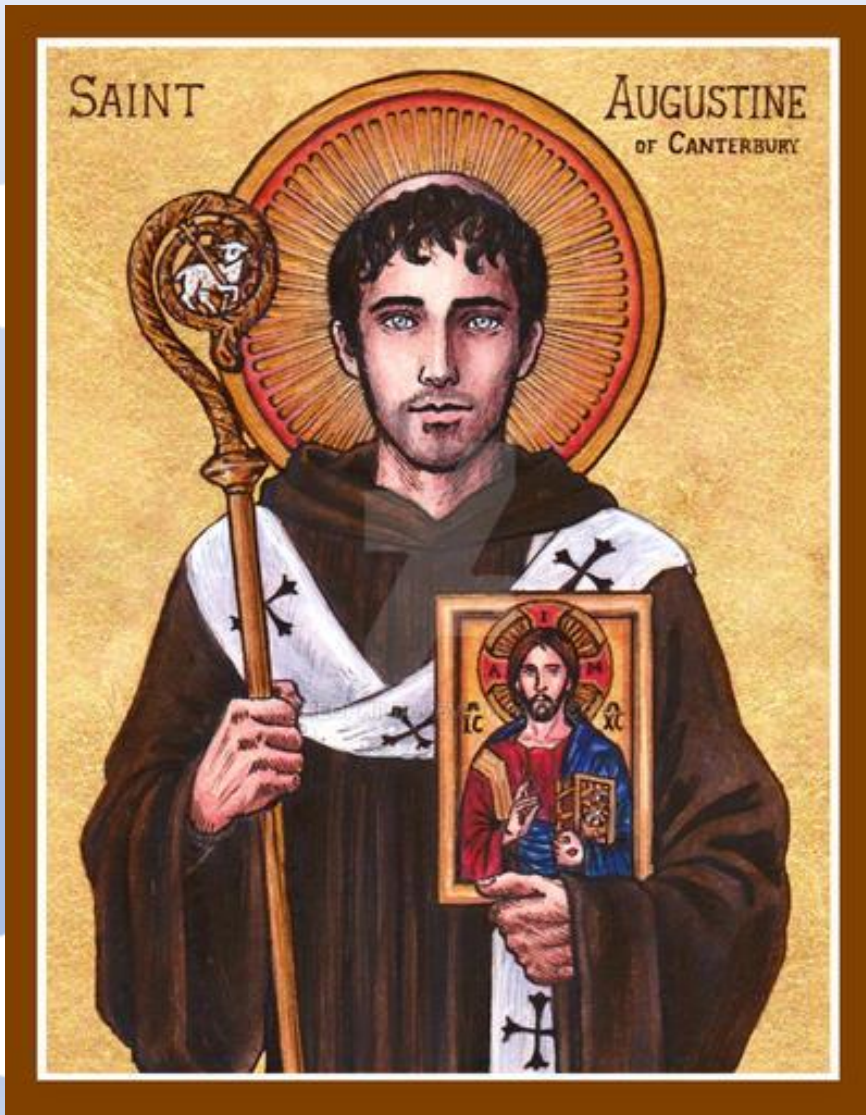

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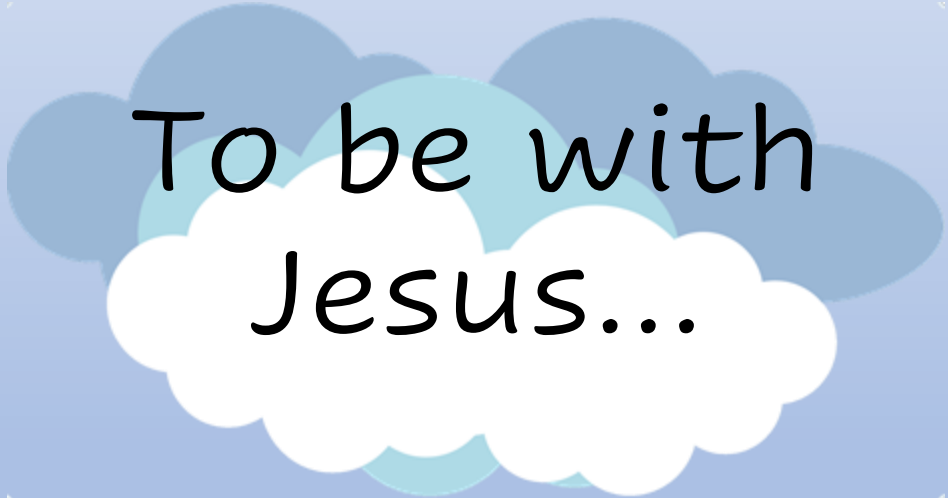

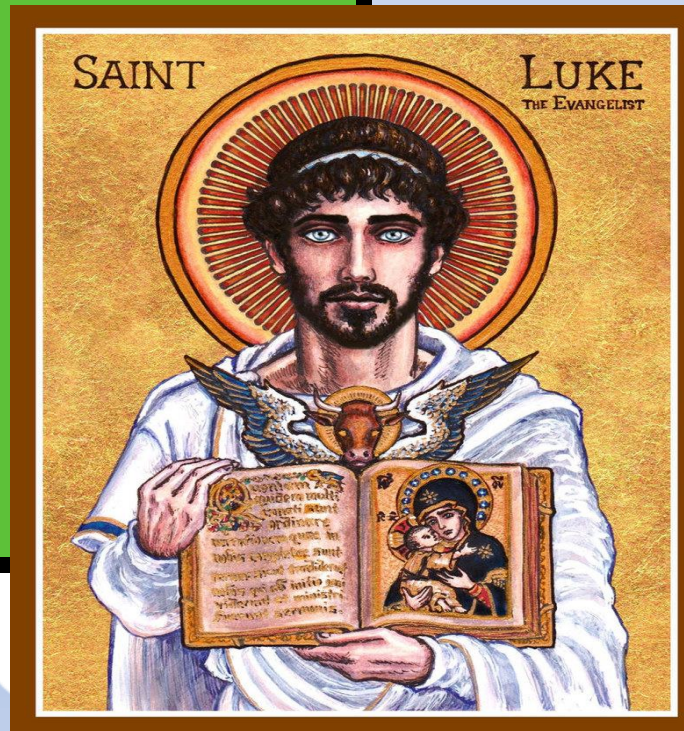
CST Theme:  
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Saturday 18<sup>th</sup> October is the Feast of St Luke the Evangelist, one of the four gospel writers. In addition to the Gospel, Luke also wrote the Acts of the Apostles. Before becoming a disciple, he was a physician.

St Luke is the patron of one of our school houses so soon everyone in Luke house will be celebrating!

We read Luke's gospel in the Liturgical Year C, so we have been reading it all this year.

St Luke's symbol is a winged ox. The ox is recognised as the animal of sacrifice because Luke's Gospel emphasises the atonement made by Christ's sacrifice of himself on the Cross.

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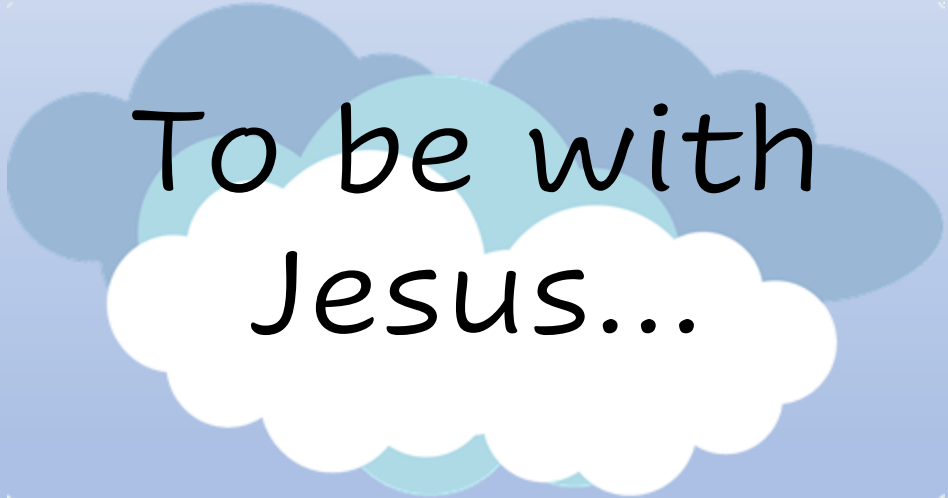

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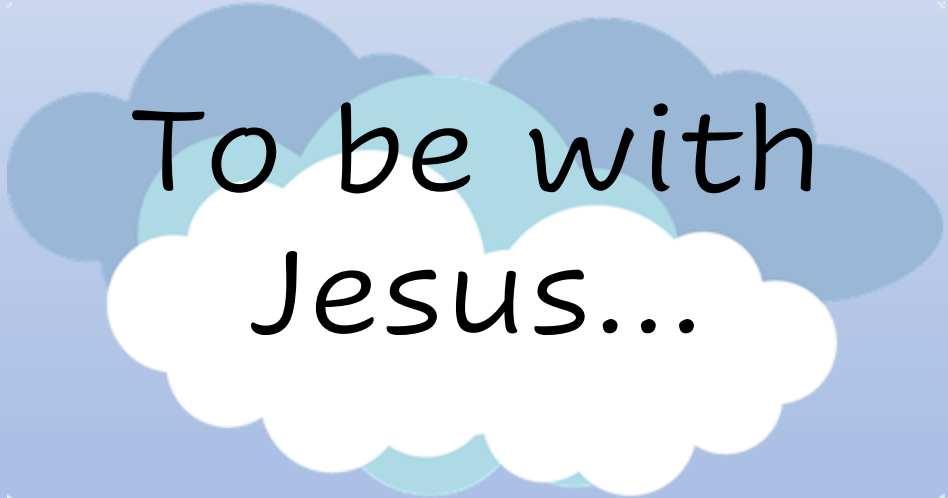

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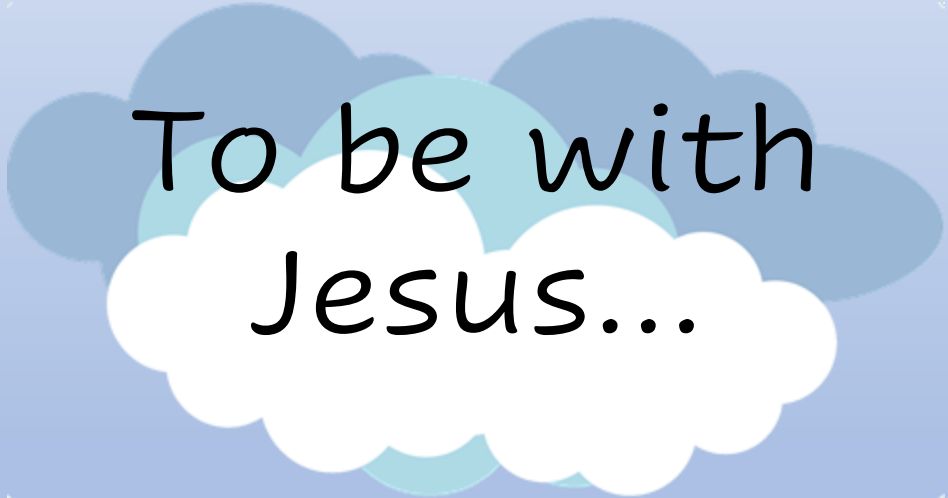




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# Examen Friday

## 3. Reflect

Become aware of your emotions and the state of your heart. Reflect on these emotions and give them to God.

## 4. Pray

Choose one joy or sorrow and turn your heart towards prayer. Pray with boldness and confidence in the Father to hear and respond as he desires.



## 5. Hope

Look with hope towards the next few hours, committing them to God with trust and hope. **Remember YOU are loved!**
