



Mr P's Gingerbread



Equipment:
Mixing bowl
Saucepan
Wooden spoon
Rolling pin
Baking tray

Ingredients:

125g unsalted butter
100g dark muscovado sugar
4 tbsp golden syrup
300g plain flour
1 tsp bicarbonate of soda
2 tsp ground ginger
1 tsp cinnamon

Instructions:

1. Melt butter, sugar, and golden syrup in a saucepan.
2. Mix flour, ginger, and cinnamon in a bowl.
3. Combine wet and dry ingredients to form a dough.
4. Roll out dough and cut into shapes.
5. Place on baking tray and bake at 180°C for 10-12 minutes.
6. Cool on a wire rack.
